A reminder during the Holy Season of Lent that **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days when adults (age 21 – 60) abstain from meat and limit themselves to one full meal a day.** Of course, all Fridays of Lent are prescribed meatless meals.

Lent begins this Wednesday, February 14th, with the distribution of Ashes during the 8:30 AM and 6:00 PM Masses. All are encouraged to attend one of these Masses.
